

8 Day Iconic Summer Eyre Peninsula Tour

The Eyre Peninsula covers over 2000 kilometres of coastline with spectacular and diverse scenic views. More than 65 percent of Australia's seafood comes from here and it cannot get any fresher than what you find here. Join us on an excellent tour to Port Lincoln and Ceduna showcasing natural wonders, local produce, history, and the fabulous hospitality of the Eyre Peninsula.

Day 1 Our Eyre Peninsula Explorer begins in Adelaide by 7am. We travel along the Princess Highway to Snowtown and Port Augusta. Enjoy a lunch stop at the Arid Lands Botanical Gardens before continuing our journey south along the coast to the peaceful fishing village of Arno Bay. Take the estuary boardwalk with numerous observation decks and winding its way through mangroves, samphire, and mudflats.

Back on the road we travel a short distance to Tumby Bay, home of the newest addition to the Silo Art Trail in South Australia. Created with 430 litres of paint the 2200 sqm mural is quite a masterpiece. Today's destination Port Lincoln is only a 30-minute drive away and is situated on the shore of Boston Bay, a natural deep-water harbour with a size three times bigger than Sydney Harbour. We stay at the award-winning Port Lincoln Hotel for the next four nights of our tour. [Overnight Port Lincoln Hotel Ocean View Balcony Rooms, BL, RD](#)



Day 2 This morning we journey to the foot of the Eyre Peninsula and travel along the Whalers Way, a 14km long series of unsealed tracks which traverse through private property. Take in the spectacular rugged coastline of the area, with many points of interest and stunning views.

Port Lincoln is the seafood and aqua culture capital of Australia, also called the “Seafood Frontier”, boasting the largest fishing fleet off any Australian town or city. We make our way to the Fresh Fish Place, which has become the leading fish processing factory of Port Lincoln. Look behind the scenes during the Seafood Lovers Tour and taste some of their most sought-after catch.



After lunch we discover the Lincoln Cove Marina, Porter Bay, Port Lincoln National Park and Boston Island by boat. Enjoy a tasting of local seafood such as prawns, mussels, sashimi tuna and kingfish. Take in views of Port Lincoln that can only be seen from the water and get first-hand information about the importance of Port Lincoln's fishing industry. Hear how the seafood trade has changed and how the Southern Bluefin Tuna has made Port Lincoln one of the richest towns in Australia. Finish the day with a drink on your very own hotel room balcony. Day 3 Today we travel to Coffin Bay one of the world's best oyster growing regions with stunning white beaches and scenery. Take in magnificent views from well selected lookouts and experience the pristine nature of Coffin Bay National Park. We continue our Eyre Peninsula discovery and embark on a fun and entertaining hands-on shucking lesson at a local oyster farm. Embark. During our tour, we waded out into the water and taste fresh Pacific and native Angasi Oysters straight from the bay. It cannot get any fresher than this.



After lunch at the Oyster HQ, we drive back to Port Lincoln and visit Boston Bay Wines. Enjoy a structured wine tasting while overlooking the beautiful vineyards and the bay. Step back in time at the Axel Stenross Maritime Museum. Located on the waterfront the museum is home to an impressive collection of historic vessels, relics, photographs and celebrates the lives of Axel Stenross and Frank Laakso. Back at the Port Lincoln Hotel why not finish the day with a leisurely walk along the foreshore. [Overnight Port Lincoln Hotel, FB, BL, RD](#)





Day 4 Port Lincoln is a very popular spot to drop in a line for catching amazing fish or experiencing sealions and Great White Sharks up close. Today you can choose between several optional activities - a full day fishing charter or a Great White Shark Tour to Neptune Island or a swim with the Sealions. And of course, you can just head out on the boat and see the sharks without a dive. And if water activities are not your cup of tea, how about a relaxing day in Port Lincoln to explore the local shops and delicacies. [Overnight Port Lincoln Hotel, FB, RD](#)



Day 5 It is time to leave the magnificent town of Port Lincoln, and we continue our journey north along the west coast of the Eyre Peninsula. We stop at Elliston on the shores of Waterloo Bay. The town is known for its heritage jetty and its artistic flair with sculptures and murals across the region. The buildings are covered in beautifully painted images that show the life of early settlers in the area. Enjoy a comfort stop with morning tea and fun photo opportunities before we make our way to the stunning Talia Caves, the Tub Lookout, and the intriguing rock formations at Calca, the Murphy's Haystacks.



Our tour is now on route to Streaky Bay and Ceduna. Located on the panoramic shores of Murat Bay and rich in indigenous culture, Ceduna's meaning is "Resting Place". Stroll along the waterfront and take in a beautiful sunset before a delicious dinner. The top-quality Foreshore Hotel is our accommodation for the next two nights. Day 6 Today we travel to Fowlers Bay a hidden paradise with kilometres of white sandy beaches and crystal-clear blue water. Enjoy a walk along the jetty or take a walk up the white sand dunes for amazing views of the bay.



For lunch we make our way to Penong. Penong is a small wheatbelt town on the Nullarbor Plain and is now known for its array of windmills from small to extra-large. Not only are the windmills fabulous photo objects, so is Lake Mac Donnell an iconic destination on the Eyre Peninsula. Walk down the so-called Watermelon Avenue with a pink salt lake on one side and a blue-green lake on the other. We return to Ceduna with time to visit the local art centre or shops before dinner. Day 7 This morning we farewell the coast and travel inland, the Central Eyre Peninsula characterised by open farmland, untouched wilderness, and unique landscapes. Edward John Eyre first discovered Minnipa in 1839, mapped and recorded the native names of unique granite rocks in the area. Walk to the top or take the easy path at the base of Pildappa Rock, an inselberg with the highest and longest wave formations on the Eyre Peninsula. We continue our journey to the largest exposed granite monolith in South Australia, Mount Wudinna. Surrounded by Mallee bushland the area is a great scenic spot for lunch.



Back on the road our next stop takes us to the Whites Knob Lookout in Kimba. Great for excellent views and some photos of the Edward John Eyre Sculptures, an artistic tribute to the early explorers. Kimba is also home to a stunning and very colourful silo art, which cannot be missed on our journey. We arrive in Port Augusta early evening and finish the day with a delicious restaurant meal. **Overnight The Standpipe Port Augusta, FB, BL, RD**



Day 8 For our journey home today, we drive to Kadina, a township on the Yorke Peninsula. Visit the Farm Shed Museum, and you will be amazed by a magnificent collection of vintage tractors, machinery, farming memorabilia, and uncountable displays. After lunch we take on the last stretch to Adelaide and it is time to say our goodbyes. Arrive in Adelaide by 4pm. **FB, BL**
